
Maudslay state park is a large sprawling property in the small seaport town of Newburyport, Massachusetts. The 450-acre park was once home to a wealthy investment banker Frederick Strong Moseley and his family. The Moseleys were an old English family that first came to America in the early 1600s. The family created a large estate that they named Maudsleigh after their ancestral home in England. The property had once housed two mansions, a castle, many greenhouses, and an expansive garden but many had long been demolished, destroyed or fallen into ruin by the time the state purchased the land for five million dollars in 1985 and renamed it Maudslay: See http://historyofmassachusetts.org/maudslay-park-in-newburyport-mass/

Throughout its 480 acres, Maudslay State Park encompasses a network of 16 miles of trails, many of which are carriage roads. You can spend as little as 30 minutes here or as much as an entire day.

Formerly a country estate dating back to 1805, the park is famous for its formal gardens as well as its mountain laurels and rhododendrons. The park has about 1.5 miles of frontage on the Merrimack River and the trails traverse park-like landscapes, meadows, woodsy paths, and even ravines so it has something for everyone.

TO JOIN THE DRIVING TOUR - DEPARTING FROM WILMINGTON, MA:

- We will meet @ 10:30 AM at the Wilmington Arts Building, 219 Middlesex Ave.
 (Route 62), Wilmington MA, to assemble our group in the parking lot, before departing for our scenic driving tour up to Newburyport on back roads. We will depart from Wilmington @ 11:00 AM sharp. Please arrive on time. Drive time to Newburyport is about an hour.
- We will park and set off to a nearby area for a picnic lunch. <u>Lunch is bring your own</u>; have fun and be creative. <u>Be sure to bring water or something to drink</u>. You may want to bring a picnic blanket, or lightweight foldable camping chairs, but there are a few picnic tables available in different locations throughout the park.
- After lunch, we can enjoy the miles of trails taking in tree canopied wooded old carriage paths, views of the Merrimac River, and if in bloom, flowering Rhododendrons.
- MAUDSLAY STATE PARK DIRECTIONS AND PARKING: Daily Parking Fee: \$5 MA
 Vehicle, \$6 non-MA Vehicle. Maudslay State Park is located in north-eastern
 Massachusetts, on the North Shore. Not joining us for the driving tour up from
 Wilmington. MA? You can meet up with us directly at the state park ~ 12 noon:
- From North and South: Take Rte. 95, exit 57 to Rte. 113 east. Follow 113 east for half a mile and turn left on Noble St. At stop sign turn left onto Ferry Rd., bear left at fork and follow signs.
- From West: Take I-495 exit 55 to Rte. 110 east. At third light take right onto Merrill Street. Continue on Merrill St./Spofford St. for 1.5 miles. Turn right before stop sign onto Ferry Rd., follow signs. 600gle Maps: https://tinvurl.com/MaudslavParkDirections



The New England British Reliability Run September 8th-10th

The New England British Reliability Run is a British car enthusiast's dream!

The Reliability Run is not a race. It is conducted on public roads at posted speeds. It is not a road rally either, in that there are no checkpoints or deliberately vague instructions. Teams travel in groups, taking care to keep together, taking stops as necessary. The run is a fun drive on great roads through beautiful countryside in the company of fellow British car hobbyists, and all for a good cause. It is a chance to join 30 other drivers from New England and test how you and your classic British car stand up to an exciting 3-day drive through some of America's most beautiful back roads. Similar events are being held in Washington, DC, Pennsylvania, and Colorado.

For the 2017 New England British Reliability Run we will be chasing the Appalachian Trail as it crosses the White Mountains of New Hampshire and continues into Maine. Our route will take us through the famous major notches in the White Mountains, as well as some of the lesser known, but equally stunning, smaller notches in the northern New Hampshire and Western Maine mountains. Along the route we will cross over the Appalachian Trail numerous times as it winds north from Georgia for 2190 miles to the end in northern Maine. The fall foliage comes early in the high mountains and the scenery should be absolutely breathtaking. I have driven these roads in both my 52 MG TD & 69 MGB; they are challenging but not in any way too taxing for our British iron. If my 52 TD "Lord Winston" can tackle these notches, any well kept British car can follow. Our route will take us over about 600 miles of back roads through the marvelous colors that can only be seen in New England...saddle-up, let's get driving!




